

## 2015 Chardonnay

Flor de Campo, Spanish for “wildflower”, seeks to capture the best of cool climate viticulture from Santa Barbara County. Grapes for the 2015 Flor de Campo were selected from several outstanding cool climate vineyards in Santa Barbara County including La Rinconada and Sanford & Benedict in the heart of the Sta. Rita Hills. This minerality of the Sta. Rita Hills is nicely balanced by tropical. After gently whole cluster pressing, the wine was fermented in both tank and French Oak barrels. This versatile Chardonnay is a nice complement to seafood and lighter dishes.

**Appellation:** Santa Barbara County

**Varietals:** 100% Chardonnay

**Color:** Straw with hints of gold

**Aroma:** Tropical (banana and pineapple) and stone fruits with notes of honeycomb

**Taste:** Fruit forward with nice acidity to keep it lively on the palate

**Fermentation:** After gentle whole clustering, the wine is fermented in both tank and French Oak barrels

**Aging:** 8 months in 100% French Oak

**Alcohol:** 13.9%
