

2016 Chardonnay

Flor de Campo, Spanish for “wildflower”, seeks to capture the best of cool climate viticulture from Santa Barbara County. Grapes for the 2016 Flor de Campo were selected from several outstanding cool climate vineyards in Santa Barbara County, including our estate vineyards, La Rinconada and Sanford & Benedict in the heart of the Sta. Rita Hills. This versatile Chardonnay is a nice complement to seafood and lighter dishes.

Appellation: Santa Barbara County

Varietals: 100% Chardonnay

Color: Straw with hints of gold

Aroma: Pineapple and pear with notes of honeysuckle

Taste: Nicely balanced by ripe tropical fruits and crisp citrus

Fermentation: After gentle whole clustering, the wine is fermented in both tank and French Oak barrels

Aging: 6 months in 100% French Oak
