

2011 Dueling Pistols

On July 11, 1804 off the Hudson shore at Weehawken, the original Federalist, Alexander Hamilton was shot in a duel by Aaron Burr and died from his injuries. Since dueling is no longer socially acceptable, we suggest solving problems over a glass of this "dual" of Zinfandel and Syrah. This wine exhibits bright cherry jam aromas, with big fruit flavors enhanced by hints of spice and lively acidity.

Appellation: Dry Creek Valley

Varietals: 50% Zinfandel & 50% Syrah

Color: Dark Purple

Aroma: Dark fruits of blackberry and black cherry

with black pepper and spice

Taste: Good entrance with a rich mouth feel and

supple tannins

Fermentation: Each varietal is blended together using only the

free run portion. The individual lots spend an

average of 15 days on the skins. Upon completing primary fermentation, the wine

undergoes malolactic fermentation.

Aging: The separate blocks of zinfandel and syrah

are blended post malolactic fermentation and are aged for 15 months in 20% new

oak barrels.
